


Prince Edward Becomes Our New King! 1901

The Coronation of King Edward VII has taken place (August 1902) with celebrations throughout the nation.

In Wolverton, there has been a procession led by the Fire Brigade and Band with free teas for children. A special treat was the roasting of an ox where everyone who brought a plate was allowed to

participate - meaning only local people took part.
