Clue: MK46 4AD


Look in the Church of St Peter and St Paul. Please be quiet and mindful of anyone using the church. How many fonts are there? How many pulpits are there?

Family Heritage Hunters

Families are challenged to visit different areas of Milton Keynes to find the heritage on their doorstep.

Broughton Village

Clue: MK10 9AA

Walk along London Road from Dean Forest Way towards the Broughton Hotel. You will pass a large house on the left. When was it built? Can you find the initials of the man who built it?

If you wanted to go into the church, what would you have to do? What is the name of the organization that looks after the church?

You will pass the old school on the right. What are the date and initials on it?

Cross Ambergate to follow the redway. You can see Brooklands Farmhouse on the other side of Newport Road. There is not a farm anymore: who uses the house?

Follow the redway almost as far as Broughton Manor School. How far is it to Woburn? To Newport Pagnell? To London?

Wolverton

Clue: MK12 5RL

Find the Old Bath House community centre. Outside there is an old Victorian roll top bath. What is it used for now?

Find the secret garden on Stratford Road. There is a Bill Billings sculpture. How many people are sitting on the sofa?

Go to Wolverton Town Hall. There are some clues about Wolverton's past. What is the black object you can see outside?

Go to Market square. What bird is on the plinth?

City Discovery Centre

Clue: MK13 9AP

At the Bradwell Abbey medieval site, have a hunt around. From the courtyard car-park, walk through the gap in the buildings. There are several panels with information on tucked away, as well as lovely old buildings to see. Use your surroundings on site to answer these questions...

Can you tell the difference between the newer buildings and the very old ones? Newer ones are usually made of brick - what are the old medieval buildings here made from?

Watch the surface of the large medieval pond (not too far from the monk sculpture). What can you see swimming in there? These would have been an important source of food to the monks.

When the little chapel was built in around 1350, who was it mainly made for? (Clue: These people travelled far and wide...)

Newport Pagnell

Clue: MK46 4AJ

Find the Tickford Bridge. This is the oldest Iron Bridge still in use. When was it finished? (the date is on the Bridge)

Find the thatched building Lovat Crest. It has a distinctive black and white architectural style. What era is this from?

Find 84 Silver Street. This house is built in the architectural style of a particular area. Which era is it?

Can you find Chandos Hall Museum? It is tucked up an alleyway. Who did the building belong to in the past?
