The Inaugural meeting of the Playing Fields Committee took place at the Sports Pavilion Perry Lane on 17th September 1980.

Present representing the Sheringham Cricket Club was Mr Paul Ralph and Mr Steve Himelcliffe.

Representing the Sheringham Football Club was Mr Bernard Haynes and Mr Graham Kinne.

Representing the Parish Council was Mr D. Chuseman and Mr P. Smith.

Mr Smith explained to the members present that the Parish Council, in drawing up a constitution for the new committee had decided that the chairman of the committee would always be a representative of the Parish Council and in this instance it would be Mr P. Smith.

The Chairman then asked if anybody would be prepared to carry out the Secretary's functions, Mr Chuseman said he would and this was agreed by other members present.

Sports Pavilion

The Chairman stated that the Parish Council had discussed the report raised by the two council representatives on the state of the sports pavilion and had agreed to allocate £1,000 to bring the

position up to an acceptable standard.

It was agreed by the committee that the report would be reviewed at the next meeting and from it priorities would be allocated, in addition it would be discussed what works would be by voluntary labour and what would be by contract.

Playing Field Area

The cricket club representatives stated that the present cricket table was extremely dangerous and had to be re-laid within 3-4 weeks to be ready for the 1981 season.

They would however had liked to move the table further into the centre of the field, but this would mean encroaching onto the football field.

After a general discussion it was agreed that the re-laying of the table would be held in abeyance pending the outcome of talks with the Chairman of the Parish Council and the landowner Mr J. Cook, with a view to leasing the whole of the field, which would make the cricket table positioning more acceptable in the long term and the football field in a more permanent position as well as 'freeing' other areas for other sports.

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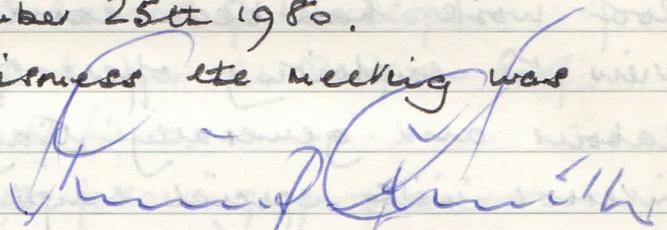
Pavilion Repairs

Mr Ralph stated that he would try and make arrangements for the plumbing for the showers to be carried out by voluntary labour and for any decorating materials required to be supplied at cost price.

Mr Kinross stated he would look after the manufacture of the window bars himself.

The date for the next meeting was fixed for 11.0 AM Sunday September 25th 1980.

B. Haynes and G. Kinross on behalf of

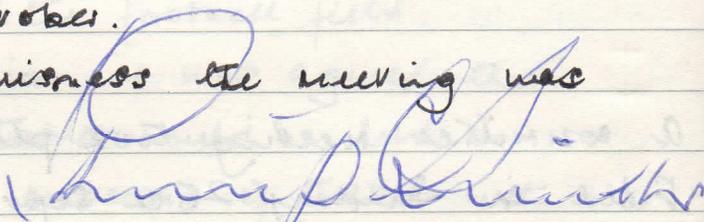
the Football Club accepted responsibility for the work in the Shower Room with the committee members, other than the plumbing.

The Chairman would see a building contractor before October 2nd 1980 for advice and for a tentative cost of works to the Pavilion Roof in order that the building was made weatherproof before any bad weather set in.

Another meeting would be called when Roof work had been carried out with a view to exploiting offers of voluntary labour and generally tidying up the interior with special emphasis on the decor.

A date for the next meeting would be finalised later, possibly late October.

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A committee meeting took place in the Village Hall on Tuesday 20th January 1981. Present was the Chairman Mr P. Smith, the Clerk, Mr Kevin Lock, Mr Paul Ralph, Mr Bernard Haynes and Mr Steve Hinchcliffe. The minutes of the previous committee meeting were read confirmed and signed.

Matters Arising - Roof Work

The Chairman stated that between the previous meeting and this one on October 1st 1980, he had contacted a Mr J.C. Collins of Hamelope to carry out remedial work on the Pavilion roof for an approximate sum of £200.

On October 2nd 1980 the following proposition was put to the Stevington Parish Council and passed by them. "That Mr. Collins of Hamelope be asked to carry out remedial works to the roof of the pavilion for an approximate sum of £200, the work to be completed by 31st October."

Mr Smith stated that the work had in fact cost £293.00

Before the next business, Mr David Byrne was asked to report by ^{the} Chairman with reference to the offer a "Terrapin Building".

Briefly it was that it was a portable type building of 180' x 54' floor area, in good

condition situated at Olney and it was
on offer for an approximate sum of £2000.
It was resolved that Mr Lock & Mr Hinchcliffe
would visit the site and inspect the building
during the week. The remainder of the committee would
also carry out a visit on Sunday 25th January.
Because the offer of the building was only open
for a limited period of time it was agreed
that an extraordinary meeting would be held
at Mr Paul Ralph's home at 34 Carvers Close
on Tuesday 27th January to discuss the site
visit and formulate if necessary a plan
of action.

The meeting continued, after thanking Mr Byrne,
with the Chairman explaining to the committee
that 2 bills had to be paid. The first one
was an overhauling bill presented by PHILIP E. SMITH
for works carried out at the Pavilion 2 years ago
of £234.34. £100 had been paid off this and
the balance now had to be paid off.

The second bill was in fact a promissory note
for £150 to be paid to Mr P. Gardner, that was
2 years overdue. After discussion it was
agreed that these two accounts would be
presented to the Parish Council for payment

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at their next meeting. The Chairman stated that there was left in the bank account of the now defunct Playing Fields Association a sum of £169 which would be transferred to the Parish Council.

The Chairman asked the cricket club what they felt needed to be done to the Pavilion before their season began? The reply was that the grass needed sharpening & repairing which would be arranged by Paul Ralph / Mike Hawkins. In addition it was felt that the interior needed decorating and the glass replacing when broken. Paul Ralph would see to the paint, but would the Parish Council buy the glass at roughly £100?

The football club when asked the same question would like the showers finished off and the ditch cleaned out behind the pavilion.

Steve Hinchcliffe asked could the pipes at the bottom of the field be cleared away and could the whole area be tidied up? It was agreed to ask the Parish Council.

There being no other business the meeting was closed.

An extraordinary meeting took place at the home of Mr Paul Ralph on January 27th 1981. Present was the Chairman Mr P. Smith, Mr. D. Chaceman, Mr B. Haynes, Mr Steve Hinchcliffe, Mr Kelvin Lock, Mr Graham Kinnor & Mr Paul Ralph.

The meeting was called to discuss the visit by committee members to the site at Olney where a portable building was on offer, and the action to take from that visit.

By way of comment it was known that a verbal offer for £5,000 had been made for the building and so after discussion it was agreed the following, on a proposal put forward by Kelvin Lock.

(1) If the offer of £5,000 was offered and accepted by the Energy Co. then the committee would make an offer to the purchaser with a view to buying a portion of the building.

(2) After clearance with the Parish Council the committee would make a written offer of a thousand pounds to the Energy Equipment Co. of Leigham Buzzard, with a copy to David Byrne, the offer to be drawn up by Paul Ralph.

at a total cost of £50.60, this would be sufficient to build a lean to 12' long x 6' high (2 sides) & 1 end 9' long x 6' high.

A preliminary check of the actual requirements was made and it was agreed that a plan should be produced and the quantity revised. This to be done by the Secretary.

Any other Business.

Pavilion Plans

It was expressed that the Parish Council were in favour of a new pavilion, although their financial commitment was not forthcoming.

Development grants from the Boro' Council and Sports Council were discussed but it was agreed that the committee must get the plans accepted first.

It was proposed by S. Hinchcliffe to thank David Bynne for his preliminary plans and to ask him to present them to the Borough Council for their acceptance, it was thought this would cost about £40, would the Parish Council pay?

Mr Cook to speak with David Bynne.

Mr Cook proposed that the committee think about getting estimates for the building of the pavilion, to ascertain the likely cost.

Chris Smith is to be asked to look into the 'grants' from the Boro' Council, whilst Mr Cook

and Mr Kinross would enquire in other directions.
Mr John Reynolds asked if the Parish Council
could take steps to have the concrete pipes
at the side of the pavilion removed as well
as the derelict car, which were an eyesore
and extremely dangerous to children.

It was suggested that once the pavilion was
given the "go ahead" that possibly
a management committee made up of members of
the Football & Cricket teams be appointed to
supervise and control the money raising side.
This committee of course will not detract from
the existing Playing Fields Association Committee
but will complement it.

It was stressed once again by the football club
that work on the showers couldn't start
until the completion of the "lean to", therefore
it should have immediate priority.

Pavilion Management Committee

The Secretary explained that at the previous meeting it had been agreed that the cricker and football clubs would get together with a view

to forming the "Pavilion Management Committee". This committee would be responsible for fund raising, and day to day running of the pavilion. However on reporting back to the Parish Council, the Council felt that there was no need for an additional committee but that there was a capacity for co-opting any additional members onto the committee to cope with fund raising. The result of this was that the Vice Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr Derek Ferris, had been invited to the present meeting to clarify the position.

Mr Ferris read extracts from two council meeting minutes which gave details of the constitution of the present Playing Fields Committee, this didn't allow for an additional committee and could only be allowed by changing the constitution. There was a separate account, administered by the Parish Council, called the "New Pavilion Account" which had at present £125.75 lodged in it from "Shefo". It was agreed, after a lengthy discussion, that a "fund raising group" would be formed made up from cricket/football club representatives plus others whose function would be to raise funds for the new pavilion, the "day to day" running would be carried out by this committee.
