#### 4. Insurance.

Tony Pitcher informed the committee that his latest information was that the P.C. insurance covered accidental damage or injury to spectators.

Participants in the games accepted the risk of personal injury.

#### 5. Budget for Next Year.

Tony Pitcher presented a budget statement for the period April 90 - April 91 showing expenditure of £2328.00. With recurring costs of £1727 and major works of £601. A. Sparks made the point that the receipts had not been deducted and the schedule was somewhat mis-leading. Essential costs are:
