2. PREVIOUS MINUTES

The minutes of meeting held 3 December were read, agreed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING

Plane Tree School Lane letter BMK advising tree needs replanting.

Planning Application White Hart letter BMK advising the application had been amended to exclude the proposed demolition of the stable block and sheds and to be only for the demolition of the disused toilet.

Park Road Footpath letter BMK querying the length of path. It was agreed Councillors would hold a further site meeting to define the area concerned. A site meeting would also be arranged with BCC.

BCC Bridleway 16 - Bypass letter advising it was not considered that warning signs are appropriate in this case. Matter to be taken up by the Chairman at the next Road Safety Committee meeting.

BCC Visiting Itinerants letter advising that the Borough hoped to evict on 4/5 December (actual 6 December).

Parish Funding letter BMK advising a provisional sum for Sherington as £2220 (at present £2628). It was agreed that the Council would wish to be advised in the event of any Parish Council making a submission for an increase which would result in a further reduction in the sum allocated to Sherington. If possible Clerk to inquire regarding funding of other Parishes.

It was agreed that the Clerk to arrange a meeting as between Mr Pepper and Planning BMK to discuss the recent changes to No. 44 Water Lane.


8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Recreational Field Lease (BMK/PC) letters from Parish Council to Hawkins and BMK to Parish Council had crossed. Details awaited from Hawkins.



2. PREVIOUS MINUTES

The minutes of meeting held 4 March 1986 were read, agreed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING

Park Road Footpath Works letter from BMK advising grant aid has been had been considered by the Environmental Grants Panel and it was resolved "that a grant of £500 be offered to the Parish Council to meet their share of the cost of the proposed works.". It was agreed a letter be forwarded to residents of Park Road advising them of the works and the possible inconvenience. (Clerks note: BCC started work the morning after the meeting and the letter was therefore not sent.)

Letter to be forwarded to BMK acknowledging thanks and that we are of one accord with the views expressed.

Appeal : B R Temple, 44 Water Lane. It was agreed a copy of the Council's original objections be forwarded to the Department of Environment.

Village Hall Committee Councillor Cheeseman advised Council following the recent Committee meeting and advised that a letter had been forwarded to BMK requesting advice on questions raised at the meeting.

Dogs Fouling It was agreed a very clear and precise notice be placed in SCAN regarding advice on legal procedures for prosecuting owners of dogs seen fouling footpaths etc. Advice on the wording to be sort from Mr Pettigrew, Legal, BMK (using laymans terms).

Housing Mr B Tofts Mr Tofts was requesting the Council's support in his application for a three bedroom house in Perry Lane. It was agreed BMK be advised of the situation and the Parish Councils support.

Meeting 23 March It was agreed that with the following deletion "Borough of Milton Keynes to be advised requiring grant aid" the meeting notes be signed. The following was ratified:

Peter Smith

- a) Kerbing, School Lane, Crofts End - this matter to be implemented at the appropriate time.
- b) The Knoll - quotes be obtained from three landscape gardeners regarding posts and chains around the perimeter from the Bus Stop to Charlie Haynes property. The Chairman advised that BCC had stated posts must be 24" from the front of the granite setts - at present they are some 50". John Cook advised on the posts used by Harpenden Council around their open space. Clerk to query and ascertain, if possible, the type fitted.

Letter to be forwarded to Mr Follows regarding environmental improvement in conjunction with that shown in the Village Plan; indicating the Council wish to re-instate The Knoll and advising of the imminent works and longer term project of closing off middle entrance. Query question of grant aid.

- c) Mowers - it was resolved that subject to a satisfactory demonstration the Council proceed with the purchase of All/36 Ride-on mowers at the price of 1299.95 including VAT from O'Dells. The larger of the two Council mowers to be offered in part exchange on the new purchase. Councillor Gardner to arrange demonstration etc. at the earliest date as the mowing season was almost to commence.

Tenders to be sought for cuts every two weeks throughout the growing season (Play Area, The Knoll, Recreational Field).

- d) It was agreed the sum of up to £50.00 be spent on the purchase and placement of three trees along School Lane from No. 2. The original trees to be dug out. Bernard Crook Nurseries to be requested to carry out the works at the earliest opportunity.
- e) Plane Tree opposite Sherington Place. It was agreed the split branch be lopped and area reinstated to its original size with appropriate surrounding to stop erosion of the area by cars/lorries etc.

19 Perry Lane The Chairman advised that the occupier had now agreed to the Borough Council being allowed entry. It was agreed BMK Housing be approached requesting whether they consider it necessary to carry out a survey on the other properties also fitted with this type of boiler.
