1. Cultural Inclusion and Diversity:

This is MKC's strategic priority for 22/23 and they are interested in supporting cultural projects that deliver to the Cultural Inclusion and Diversity Report and Recommendations at; <u>http://aha-mk.org/inclusion-and-diversity/</u>







2. Not Just Business as Usual:

MKC is looking for high-quality proposals that test out new ideas and approaches to heritage/cultural delivery within the city, pushing creative boundaries to reach and engage new audiences.







3. Collaborations and Partnership Working:

MKC is particularly interested in projects and programmes that place an emphasis on collaboration and partnership working.







4. City-wide Cultural Offer:

- where cultural activity is being delivered in contexts that will encourage **community engagement and participation**.







•EDI means the whole community regardless of age, sex, sexual orientation, ethnicity or religious belief

EDI ensures fair treatment and opportunity for all. It aims to eradicate prejudice and discrimination on the basis of an individual or group of individual's protected characteristics.
Protected characteristics are age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

•Fairness and opportunity within groups and engagement with community





MKHA actions:

•MKHA does have an equal opportunities policy – it is over 10 years old and requires further review to bring up to date against current legislation

•Grant forms and feedback requirements need to be updated to include diversity and inclusion

- •MKHA and members websites to be more accessible
- •MKHA to encourage wider membership





Activities of MKHA and member groups:

- •How can they be made more accessible?
- •Encourage wider more diverse membership of groups? and MKHA?
- Should we take a more proactive approach?
- •Should we instigate more to explore the heritage of minority communities in the area and their ethnic origins? a project?
- •May raise challenging topics e.g. slavery, discrimination, violence, empire





MKHA/MKC grants:

- •Applications must include participation/accessibility issues for the whole community
- •Outputs to be available for all
- •Link EDI projects to events such as *Heritage Open Days*, *Festival of History*
- •Projects with schools, community groups, disability groups
- •'Hint' all projects undertaken can be linked to EDI



Next steps (MKHA cannot change the world!)

- MKHA policies need to be reviewed and updated
- Small steps needed to encourage and support individual projects




Roade Local History Society – Ron Johnson
